## Centre Court - Match 1

### [WC] Jodie Burrage (WR164 – GBR) v [2] Barbora Krejčíková (WR17 – CZE)

Head to Head: First meeting.

#### JODIE BURRAGE

- 3rd main draw appearance at Eastbourne – R16 in previous two (2022, 2023). Defeated WR-4 Paula Badosa in 2022 – best win by a British woman other than Konta since 2013.
- Fell to eventual finalist Anisimova in R1 at Queen's a fortnight ago – lost in qualifying at Nottingham.
- Bids to become 1st British woman to defeat reigning Wimbledon champion on grass since Wade defeated Evert, 1977 Wimbledon SF.
- Bids to reach 3rd WTA Tour QF (2023 Nottingham, 2024 Linz).
- Bids to become 12th different British woman in Eastbourne QF (note: Jones can also reach QF).
- Bids to become 2nd lowest ranked woman in Eastbourne QF since 1991 (Emma Raducanu, WR-168 last year).
- Wild card at Wimbledon this year (one of 7 handed to British women – most since 2005).
- Maiden WTA Tour final at 2023 Nottingham, falling to compatriot Katie Boulter – 1st all-British WTA singles final since 1977.
- Biggest title of career at W100 Dubai last December.
- Finalist at ITF Ilkley in 2022 and QF at WTA 500 event in Linz last year.
- Career-high ranking of No. 85 in September 2023.
- Best result at Grand Slams R2, at Wimbledon 2023, at 2023 US Open and at this year's Australian Open.
- Won WTA Tour doubles title at Cluj Napoca in 2023 alongside partner Jil Teichmann.
- Partnered Katie Boulter in Great Britain's decisive doubles win over the Netherlands in Billie Jean King Cup qualifiers in April.
- WTA Tour main win-loss record in 2025 is 5-4.
- Overall WTA Tour main draw win-loss record on grass is 10-9 – four of those wins came in run to 2023 Nottingham final.
- Injury plagued 2024 season, missing almost seven months, from February to September 2024, with a wrist injury that required surgery, followed by an ankle injury.
- 1-6 win-loss record against top 20 players – only victory against WR-4 Badosa here in 2022.

#### BARBORA KREJČIKOVA

- 3rd appearance at Eastbourne – 1-2 win-loss record – fell to Kostyuk in 2022 and to Fernandez last year – 1st win v Dart yesterday (1st win on grass since last year's Wimbledon final).
- Fell to Sramkova in R1 at Queen's fortnight ago.
- Bids to reach 27th WTA Tour QF, 4th on grass, and 1st of 2025.
- Bids to become 13th different Czech woman in Eastbourne QF – others include former Wimbledon champions Navratilova, Novotna, Kvitova.
- Reigning Wimbledon champion – also won at 2021 Roland Garros.
- 8 WTA Tour singles titles.

- 7 major doubles titles, including career Grand Slam.
- Finalist at 2023 Birmingham, falling to Ostapenko.
- Career-high ranking of No. 2 in February 2022.
- 5 matches on WTA Tour this year (2-3 win-loss record) due to back problems.
- 4-0 win-loss record against Brits on grass.
- Last defeat to player ranked as low as Burrage was to WR-251 Hibino, 2022 Prague. Never lost WTA main draw match on grass to player ranked as low as Burrage.

## Centre Court - Match 2

### Maya Joint (WR51 – AUS) v [7] Emma Raducanu (WR38 – GBR)

#### MAYA JOINT

- Eastbourne debut, and WTA Tour main draw debut on grass.
- Bids to reach 4th WTA Tour QF, 4th of 2025, and 1st on grass.
- Bids to become 10th different Australian woman in Eastbourne QF, and 1st since Barty in 2018 (note: Birrell can also reach QF).
- If her and Birrell both win will be 1st time multiple Australian women in Eastbourne QF since 1980 (Fromholtz, Turnbull), and 4th time overall (also 1974, 1979).
- Maiden WTA Tour title this year, defeating Cristian at Rabat on clay in May – 1st Australian to win WTA Tour title since Ashleigh Barty, 2022 Australian Open. Also won doubles title at Rabat.
- Also SF at Hobart at start of year.
- Currently at career-high ranking of No. 51.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 14-10.

#### EMMA RADUCANU

- QF on Eastbourne debut last year, falling to eventual champion Kasatkina.
- QF at Queen's a fortnight ago, falling to Qinwen Zheng.
- British Number One again for 1st time in 2 years.
- Bids to reach 13th WTA Tour QF, 3rd of 2025, and 4th on grass.
- Bids to become 6th British woman in Eastbourne QF on multiple occasions, after Wade (1975, 1976, 1978, 1979), Durie (1982, 1983), Konta (2015, 2016, 2017), Watson (2014, 2017) and Dart (2022, 2024),
- Won 2021 US Open singles title without dropping set – 1st qualifier to win Grand Slam singles title, and the 1st British woman to win major singles title since Virginia Wade at 1977 Wimbledon.
- Career-high ranking of No. 10 in July 2022 – 5th British woman to achieve this feat, after Wade, Barker, Durie and Konta.
- Since 2021 US Open best results two SF's, at 2022 Seoul and 2024 Nottingham, where fell to compatriot Katie Boulter.
- In 2021 became youngest British woman in R16 of Wimbledon in Open Era.
- Out for nine months from April 2023 to January 2024 following surgery on both wrists and left ankle.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 16-12 – best results QF at Miami and Queen's.
- Overall WTA Tour main draw win-loss record on grass is 14-8.

### Dayana Yastremska (WR42 – UKR) v [WC] Francesca Jones (WR125 – GBR)

Head to Head: Yastremska leads 1-0

#### DAYANA YASTREMSKA

- 3rd appearance at Eastbourne (0-2 main draw win-loss record before this week).
- Bids to reach 21st WTA Tour QF, and 1st at Eastbourne.
- Bids to become 3rd Ukrainian woman in Eastbourne QF, after Tsurenko and Kalinina (2022).
- Finalist at Nottingham last week, falling to Kessler.
- Finalist at Ilkley ITF event on grass in 2018, falling to Smitkova.
- Girls' singles runner-up at 2016 Wimbledon, falling to Potapova in final.
- Career-high ranking of No. 21 in January 2020.
- Won 3 WTA Tour titles – 2018 Hong Kong, 2019 Hua Hin, 2019 Strasbourg.
- Best performance in Grand Slams is SF at 2024 Australian Open.
- Lost last 2 matches on grass against players ranked as low as Jones – to WR-165 Naef, 2023 Wimbledon qualifying and to WR-157 Sonmez, 2024 Berlin qualifying.
- Lost only previous main draw match against Brit at Eastbourne, to Konta in 2019.

#### FRANCESCA JONES

- 1st main draw appearance at Eastbourne – lost in Q1 in 2021.
- 3rd event on grass this summer – R1 at Queen's (fell to Kessler) and R2 at Nottingham (beat Dart in R1).
- Bids to reach 3rd WTA Tour QF (2023 Bogota, 2024 Nottingham).
- Bids to become 12th different British woman in Eastbourne QF (note: Burrage can also reach QF).
- Best result on WTA Tour is SF, 2023 Bogota.
- Best WTA Tour result on grass is QF at Nottingham last year, where handed walkover to Emma Raducanu due to shoulder injury.
- Wild card at Wimbledon this year (one of 7 handed to British women – most since 2005). Yet to win Grand Slam main draw match (0-3 win-loss record – 2 at Wimbledon, 1 at Australian Open).
- Won 9 ITF singles titles, including two this year.
- Wild card at Wimbledon last year, but fell to Petra Martic in R1.
- Career-high ranking of No. 113 in May.
- 1-5 win-loss record against top 50 players – only victory against WR-44 Zheng Saisai, 2021 Phillips Island Trophy.
- WTA Tour main draw win-loss record in 2025 is 3-6.
- Overall WTA Tour main draw win-loss on grass is 4-7.

#### BILLY HARRIS

- Bids to reach 3rd ATP Tour QF (Queen's and Eastbourne last year).
- Bids to become 3rd British man in multiple Eastbourne QF's, after Edmund (2018, 2019) and Norrie (2018, 2022).
- Bids to become 5th lucky loser in Eastbourne QF – last was Vukic last year (reached SF).
- Three singles SF's on British grass last year, at Surbiton, Nottingham and Eastbourne. Also reached QF's at Queen's.
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at Wimbledon in 2024 as wild card, falling to Jaume Munar in R1.
- Career-high ranking of No. 101 in September 2024.
- 7 of his 9 ATP Tour main draw wins have been achieved on grass, and 5 of those wins came in Great Britain on grass last year.
- Won last 2 matches against top 100 players (both here this week).

#### MATTIA BELLUCCI

- Eastbourne debut. Victory over Halys in R1 was 1st ever ATP main draw win on grass.
- Bids to reach 4th ATP QF, 3rd of 2025, and 1st on grass.
- Bids to become 7th different Italian man in Eastbourne QF.
- Bids to become 8th qualifier in Eastbourne QF, and 2nd from Italy (Fabbiano, 2019).
- Maiden ATP SF at 500 event in Rotterdam in February as a qualifier, defeating Medvedev and Tsitsipas along way.
- Career-high ranking of No. 66 in April.
- In last match against Brit, fell to Jack Draper in R1 at Roland Garros.
